It's Party Time

Thirty minutes before the party, volunteers arrive and get to work. They hang a banner and streamers, set up toys, games, and activities, and arrange colorfully wrapped gifts on a table. Soon it's time to blast the music and welcome the eager guests. The kids rush in, ready to celebrate. Happy Birthday!

Every month, parties like this take place at homeless shelters and other transitional living facilities across the country. They're hosted by a group called the Birthday Party Project. This nonprofit organization throws birthday parties for groups of kids who don't have a permanent home. For some children, it's the first birthday party they've ever had.

Let's Celebrate

Paige Chenault is the founder of the Birthday Party Project. "Everyone wants an opportunity to feel known and seen, and a birthday is a perfect place and a perfect time in our life to stop and celebrate,"

Chenault and her family threw the Birthday Party Project's first event in January 2012, at a shelter in Dallas, Texas. "We realized serving children in our own community was a great place to start," she says. Since then, the organization has grown. Now the Birthday Party Project hosts about 50 monthly parties in 15 cities. More than 10,000 kids have celebrated their birthday at these events.

Eight-year-old Dipson is one of them. He lives in a transitional housing community in Minneapolis, Minnesota. At the party held there in March 2018, Dipson played ring toss and unwrapped his presents: Hot Wheels and a new scooter. "It was very fun," he says. But Dipson also says he learned a lesson from eating too many tasty cupcakes: "You can get a little bit sick when you have too much chocolate," he warns future partygoers.

Jamie Gates is the education support coordinator at the housing community where Dipson lives. The Birthday Party Project holds parties there on the third Thursday of each month. According to Gates, if she doesn't put up flyers for the next event at least five days in advance, kids will start asking her about it. "They love it," she says. "Parents will come to the party, too. It's a really good opportunity for them to sit and talk, and for the entire place to come together."

Chinese New Year in China



1.

Chinese New Year celebrations in China start on the 23rd day of the 12th lunar month of the Chinese calendar. The festival lasts for about 23 days .It ends on the 15th day of the first lunar month in the following year in the Chinese calendar.

China adopted the Gregorian calendar in 1911, so Chinese New Year was renamed the Spring Festival.

Many people clean their homes to welcome the Spring Festival. They put up the red posters with poetic verses on it to their doors and decorate their homes with red lanterns. It is also a time to reunite with relatives so many people visit their families at this time of the year.

In the evening of the Spring Festival Eve, many people set off fireworks and firecrackers, hoping to cast away any bad luck and bring forth good luck. Children often receive “luck” money. Many people wear new clothes and send Chinese New Year greetings to each other. Various activities such as beating drums and striking gongs, as well as dragon and lion dances, are all part of the Spring Festival festivities.

The Spring Festival is a national holiday in China. Government offices, schools, universities and many companies are closed during the period from the Spring Festival Eve to the seventh day of the first lunar month in the Chinese calendar. However, most large malls, tourist attractions, public transport, hotels, and restaurants will open as usual, or even stay open longer!

According to historical documents, on the day when Shun, who was one of ancient China's mythological emperors, came to the throne more than 4000 years ago, he led his ministers to worship heaven and earth. From then on, that day was regarded as the first day of the first lunar month in the Chinese calendar. This is the basic origin of Chinese New Year.

China adopted the Gregorian calendar in 1911, so Chinese New Year was renamed the Spring Festival.

Each new year is represented by a Zodiac animal sign. The red posters with poetic verses on it were initially a type of amulet, but now it simply means good fortune and joy. Various Chinese New Year symbols express different meanings. For example, an image of a fish symbolizes "having more than one needs every year". A firecracker symbolizes "good luck in the coming year". The festival lanterns symbolize "pursuing the bright and the beautiful".
